School mission and vision.

Mission

The mission of Notre École is to equip our students with a solid foundation for future achievement in school and life through providing:

- a quality child focused--education, focused on developing the full potential of each student
- an emphasis on global awareness and understanding
- an emphasis on developing creative thinking skills, problem--solving skills, curiosity, and perseverance
- unique STEAM learning experiences (science, technology, engineering, art, and math)
- an immersion in the French language and in Francophone cultures around the world.

Vision

Notre École is an internationally minded community of students, teachers, staff, parents, and community members who are committed to creating a school that will enable our students to develop the skills, knowledge, and insight to engage effectively with cultures throughout the ever--changing world.

Educational Philosophy and Instructional Approach

Our educational philosophy is to encourage and support student creativity and innovation by providing challenging student--centered and inquiry--based experiences that integrate skills from different subject areas while being immersed in the French language. The combination of skills gained in STEAM, French Immersion, and an environment of persistence and respect will prepare students for their roles in our global world where they will be better equipped in life and in their chosen interests. We firmly believe that giving children access to learning a new language at an early age can help reduce the achievement gap as well as open up future opportunities and increase brain growth. Tests continually show that children who have been immersed in a second language at school usually meet or exceed state standards by the time they reach 5 th grade.

Student Learning and Achievement

Notre École has high expectations regarding:

- 1. Minnesota state standards required for elementary through middle school students.
- 2. French language proficiency in reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.
- 3. The understanding how science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and the broad spectrum of the arts all relate to each other in reality.

Notre École uses a combination of teaching and learning strategies to assess student progress. A teacher's own observations, projects related to the required benchmark concepts and skills, portfolios, and classroom discussions offer clues to teachers to the children's progress, making it easier to successfully adjust lesson plans and create interventions. Students are also involved in the assessment of their own progress, as research suggests that classroom learning may be directly proportional to a student's involvement.

Student Enrollment and Demographics

Enrollment process.

Notre Ecole is a tuition free-public school and is accepting students from everywhere, no restrictions apply. Admission to pupils is not limiting on the basis of gender, race, intellectual ability, measures of achievement or aptitude, or athletic ability.

Admission's process starts by either filling in the online application on the school website or printing and filling in the application. Student must be 5 years old on or before September 1st of the enrollment year.


Notre Ecole is enrolling any eligible student who submits a timely application, unless the number of applications exceeds the capacity of a program, class, grade level, or building. When that occurs, students are placed on a waiting list.

State statutes requires that Notre Ecole gives preference for enrollment to:

- (1) a sibling of an enrolled student and to a foster child of that student's parents before accepting other students by lot,
- (2) children of Notre Ecole staff before accepting other pupils by lot,
- (3) remaining students will be selected by lottery.





For the School year 2022/2023, 71% of our teachers are experienced teachers (more than 3 years of teaching).


To reduce and eventually eliminate equitable access gaps, all teachers will benefit from Professional development and peer coaching.

Notre Ecole is a teacher powered school where teachers take on professional roles. Peer observations are conducted 2 times a year. If a teacher is identified as ineffective, administration helps them create a targeted Professional Improvement plan.

100% of our lead teachers are French native speaker or native-like. As a French immersion school, this helps to achieve our mission and provide a high quality education to all our students.

More generally, 72% of our teachers and staff are French-speakers.

Finances



Academic performance

Notre Ecole started operating in 2020/2021. The school opened its first 3rd grade section in 2022/2023 and doesn't have any MCA data from previous years.

However, Notre Ecole has established SMART Goal to close the Achievement Gap(s) Between Student Groups. At the end of the 2022/2023 school year, students will be 81% proficient in Math and French Language Arts.

Assessments and Evaluations only show a snapshot of student performance.

For Language Art, Students at Notre Ecole are assessed with a French language proficiency rubric that examines the four domains of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

In Math, Students are assessed in French with a Standards and Benchmarks rubric that examines the four domains of Counting and Cardinality, Operations and Algebraic Thinking, Measurement and Data, and Geometry.





Innovative Practices and Implementation

Notre Ecole focuses its professional development on deepening teachers' understanding of STEAM practices and French language acquisition. We are preparing students for jobs that don't even exist. STEAM's foundations lie in inquiry, critical thinking, and process-based learning. The entire idea surrounding STEAM lessons and the STEAM approach is that it is based around questioning and asking "non-Googleable" questions. Students and teachers engage in STEAM to make more real-life connections, so that school is not a place where you go to learn, but instead becomes the entire experience of learning itself. Our STEAM curriculum is imbeded into a French immersion setting which opens a large spectrum of opportunities for our students. Knowing how to speak, read, and write in another language demonstrates cognitive advantages, such as increased problem-solving skills and creativity. Students will develop an interest and curiosity about different cultures and ideas when they have a foundation in other languages. Our students will be more comfortable growing up in our increasingly global society, where languages and cultures intersect every day.

Future Plans

To keep fulfilling its mission and vision, Notre Ecole is planning to:

1) Obtain the <u>LabelFrancEducation</u>.

Awarded by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the LabelFrancEducation is an official international accreditation granted to schools offering a French bilingual program. We believe that graduating from a school which has this Label, will benefit to the future of our students.

2) Develop a partnership with universities in France and Belgium. The school is looking to develop a partnership with local universities in France and Belgium in order to welcome students-teachers who are seeking to do their internships at Notre Ecole.

3) Increase its enrollment.

Th school will add 4th and 5th grade in the next two years.
